REPRODUCTIVE HEALTHCARE

<u>Ohio Department of Health: Reproductive Health and Wellness Program</u> (services funded through Federal Title X of the Public Health Service Act, Maternal and Child Health Block Grant, and general revenue funds)

• To find out what a visit might cost, call the health center of your choice and discuss the cost of the service. Fees for services are based on family size and income and no one is denied services if they cannot pay. There is no requirement that a person live in the area in order to receive services.
